### Pointers for giving a speech.

- Select a subject that interests you.
- Investigate and gather necessary materials on your topic.
- Organize the material into an outline containing an introduction, body and conclusion.
- Write your talk word for word so you know exactly what your are going to say.
- Remember the following: <u>Rate</u> how fast or slow you talk. Intensity how loud or soft you speak. <u>Fluency</u> talk smoothly. <u>Voice Expression</u> how you express your voice. <u>Movement</u> move only when it helps you talk.. Gestures how you use your hands when speaking. <u>Facial expressions</u> facial expressions should reflect what you are saying in your speech. <u>Eye</u> <u>Contact</u> look at your audience. Do not look at the floor or ceiling.
- Practice, Practice, Practice your speech!

## **Banana Pancakes**



### Prep time: 10 minutes Cook time: 20 minutes

- 2 large very ripe bananas
- •1 cup low-fat milk
- 2 tablespoons packed light brown sugar
- 11/2 tablespoons vanilla extract
- 11/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup chopped pecans or walnuts (optional)
- Nonstick cooking spray

### **Optional Topping**

- Nonfat light vanilla vogurt
- Peanut butter
- Sliced bananas
- Cinnamon
- Wash hands with warm water and soap, scrubbing for at least 20 seconds.
- 2. Preheat a skillet or griddle on the stove over medium-low heat.
- **3.** In a medium bowl, mash the very ripe bananas using a fork or masher. Stir in the milk, brown sugar, and vanilla extract. Mix until combined.

- Add the flour, baking powder, salt, and cinnamon. Mix just until the batter is moistened with no dry spots remaining. Batter will be lumpy. Fold in nuts if using.
- Spray the heated skillet or griddle with nonstick cooking spray. Drop about a 1/4 cup of the batter into sections of the pan and spread out each into a 4-inch round.
- 6. Cook pancakes until bubbles form on top and the edges start to brown, about 6 to 8 minutes. Flip and continue cooking until the bottoms of the pancakes are golden brown and easily release from the pan, about 3 to 4 minutes more.
- 7. Transfer the pancakes to a warm plate. Repeat, cooking the remaining batter.
- 8. To serve, stack 2 pancakes on a plate and top with desired toppings. Serve immediately.
- 9. Refrigerate leftovers within 2 hours.
